

Project Name: NY Japanese Exploration with は Particle Practice**Required Materials:**

- “Genki” textbook (Chapters 1-3)
- Internet access for research
- Notebook and pen
- List of Japanese-related places in New York or Japanese websites (e.g., Japan Society NYC, Kinokuniya Bookstore, online resources like NHK Easy News)

Language Skills Practiced:

- Using the topic particle は in sentences
- Applying Genki Ch.1-3 vocabulary in context
- Forming simple questions and statements

Time Required: Approximately 1 hour**Deliverable:** A document with 5 Japanese sentences using は and 1 Japanese question using は, based on research, submitted digitally or in writing.**Detailed Steps:**

1. Select one Japanese-related location in New York (e.g., a shop, restaurant, cultural center) or one Japanese website (e.g., for news, culture, or tourism). Use online maps or directories if needed.
2. Research basic information about the chosen place or website. Focus on aspects that can be described using Genki Ch.1-3 vocabulary, such as hours, activities, or general details. Write down 5 key facts in English in your notebook.
3. From your English notes, create 5 Japanese sentences using the topic particle は. Ensure each sentence includes a topic marked with は and uses only vocabulary from Genki Ch.1-3. Example sentences based on vocabulary:
 - 週末はやすみです。(If the place is closed on weekends)
 - わたしはがくせいです。(Adapt to context, e.g., if researching a student event)
 - かいしゃはなんじからです。(If discussing business hours)
 - にほんごのべんきょうはたのしいです。(If related to language learning)
 - ともだちはいきます。(If describing visits with friends)
4. Form one Japanese question using the topic particle は about the place or website. Example: **そのみせはなんじからですか。**
5. Compile all 5 sentences and the 1 question into a clear list. Check that vocabulary aligns with Genki Ch.1-3 and that は is used correctly.
6. Submit the list as your deliverable. Optionally, include a brief English note confirming the use of Genki Ch.1-3 vocabulary.
