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**Project Name:** NY de "Suki/Kirai" Discovery Project

**Target Level:** Beginner (Genki I Chapters 1-5)

**Materials Needed:** "Genki I" textbook (Ch.1-5), smartphone/computer with internet, notebook, presentation tool (e.g., Google Slides, poster paper).

**Language Skills Practiced:** Expressing likes/dislikes, vocabulary use (nouns, adjectives), simple sentence formation, basic presentation.

**Time Required:** Approximately 60 minutes (preparation: 40 mins, presentation: 20 mins).

### **Step 1: Vocabulary Review (10 mins)**

- Review vocabulary for food, drinks, hobbies, school subjects, and items from Genki Ch.1-5.
- Example words: さかな、コーヒー、おんがく、スポーツ、べんきょう、えいが、ほん、ともだち、せんせい。
- Make flashcards for 10 chosen words.

# **Step 2: On-Site/Online Research in NYC Context (20 mins)**

- Choose one real location in New York related to Japan. Examples:
- 1. **Sunrise Mart** (Japanese grocery store): Look for items like おちゃ、ラーメン、おかし。
- 2. **Kinokuniya Bookstore:** Look for ほん、ざっし、まんが。
- 3. **Japan Society:** Look at event listings for えいが、イベント。
- If unable to visit physically, use their official websites or social media (e.g., Instagram: @sunrisemart\_ny).
- Find 5 items/activities from the location and list them in Japanese using known vocabulary (e.g., ぎゅうにゅう、てがみ、にほんごのクラス).

### Step 3: Create "Suki/Kirai" Sentences (15 mins)

- For each of the 5 items/activities, write one sentence expressing like/dislike.
- Use the structure: [Item] がすきです。/[Item] がきらいです。
- Example sentences:
- 1. わたしはラーメンがすきです。
- 2. わたしはコーヒーがきらいです。
- Optional: Add a reason using から (Ch.5), e.g., おいしいからです。

# **Step 4: Prepare Deliverable Presentation (15 mins)**

- Create a simple poster or 3-slide digital presentation.
- Content per slide:

Slide 1: Project title, your name, chosen location (include a photo if possible).

Slide 2: List of 5 found items/activities in Japanese.

Slide 3: 3-5 "suki/kirai" sentences based on your list.

- Practice saying the sentences aloud.

### **Deliverable:**

A short presentation (poster or digital slides) shared with the class or submitted to the instructor, including the researched items and original "suki/kirai" sentences using only Ch.1-5 vocabulary.
