



Off-Campus Jobs Guide for Japan Studies Students

Overview

For students in the Japan Studies Program, off-campus part-time work can build customer-service experience, professional habits, and practical Japanese. The fields below are especially relevant in New York City because Japanese ability can be a useful bonus even when it is not required.

1 Retail: Apparel, Lifestyle, and Specialty Goods

- **Apparel and lifestyle retail**
 - **Typical roles:** Sales associate, cashier, fitting-room attendant, stock associate, visual merchandising support, or bilingual customer support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (1/5). Customer service, attention to detail, and schedule flexibility are important, and Japanese helps when explaining Japanese-brand products and assisting Japanese-speaking customers.

- **Books, stationery, gifts, and character goods**
 - **Typical roles:** Retail clerk, inventory assistant, online order packer, event sales staff, or social-media support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (2/5). Product knowledge, organization, and clear explanation are valuable, and Japanese helps with reading labels, understanding branding, and assisting customers interested in Japanese books or stationery culture.

2 Restaurants, Cafés, and Food Service

- **Japanese restaurants, ramen shops, sushi counters, bakeries, and cafés**
 - **Typical roles:** Host, cashier, server, busser, barista, kitchen helper, prep worker, or delivery/order support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (3/5). Fast communication, multitasking, and stamina are essential, and Japanese helps with menu vocabulary, communication with Japanese-speaking owners or chefs, and customer service for Japanese-speaking guests.
 - **Examples:** [Ippudo](#) / [Ichiran](#) / [Ramen Setagaya](#) / [Sunrise Mart Brooklyn](#), and many more Japanese restaurants and bars
 - **Tip:** Front-of-house vs. back-of-house. Front-of-house builds speaking confidence and customer-service experience, while back-of-house may suit students who want less public interaction.

3 Hospitality and Tourism Services

- **Hotels, front desks, event venues, and guest services**
 - **Typical roles:** Front-desk assistant, concierge support, reservation assistant, banquet staff, coat check, or event registration staff.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (3/5). Calm communication, professionalism, and scheduling accuracy are important, and Japanese helps when assisting travelers, supporting international events, and serving guests who prefer Japanese.

- **Cultural organizations and visitor services**
 - **Typical roles:** Museum store staff, visitor desk assistant, event staff, or program support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (3/5). Public interaction and event logistics are valuable, and Japanese helps when assisting visitors and supporting Japan-related public programs.

4 Legal and Community Services

- **Law offices, immigration services, and community support organizations**
 - **Typical roles:** Reception assistant, file clerk, intake assistant, appointment coordinator, interpreter support, or office assistant.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (4/5). Confidentiality, accuracy, and polite phone communication are essential, and Japanese helps with client intake and front-desk support, but students should not present themselves as legal translators or legal advisors unless formally qualified.

5 Real Estate and Property Services

- **Real estate offices, leasing support, and property management**
 - **Typical roles:** Administrative assistant, showing assistant, leasing office support, receptionist, or marketing support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (3/5). Organization, e-mail and phone professionalism, and client-facing confidence are important, and Japanese helps when working with Japanese tenants, students, or business clients seeking housing support.

6 Health, Medicine, and Wellness

- **Clinics, dental offices, therapy practices, pharmacies, and wellness businesses**
 - **Typical roles:** Receptionist, scheduling assistant, patient services assistant, records assistant, or front-desk support.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (4/5). Discretion, accuracy, empathy, and patience are essential, and Japanese helps with scheduling and check-in for Japanese-speaking patients, although students should avoid interpreting medical information beyond their training.

7 Office, E-Commerce, and Small Business Support

- **Japanese-owned small businesses and online sellers**
 - **Typical roles:** Office assistant, online shop support, customer-service associate, shipping assistant, or content assistant.
 - **Japanese skills:** ●●●●● (3/5). Clear writing, organization, and learning software quickly are valuable, and Japanese helps with supplier communication, product descriptions, and bilingual customer service.
